Frogs like damp shady places and need places to hibernate in winter. Holes and crevices under sheds, in stick piles and compost heaps can all be used by frogs.

Try This



Visit a pond through the spring and summer. Watch the frogspawn develop into tadpoles and the tadpoles into frogs. You may find toad eggs too!



Pretend to be tadpoles & frogs with some friends. Start huddled together as frogspawn, wriggle then swim as tadpoles, grow arms & legs and hop out of the pond!
